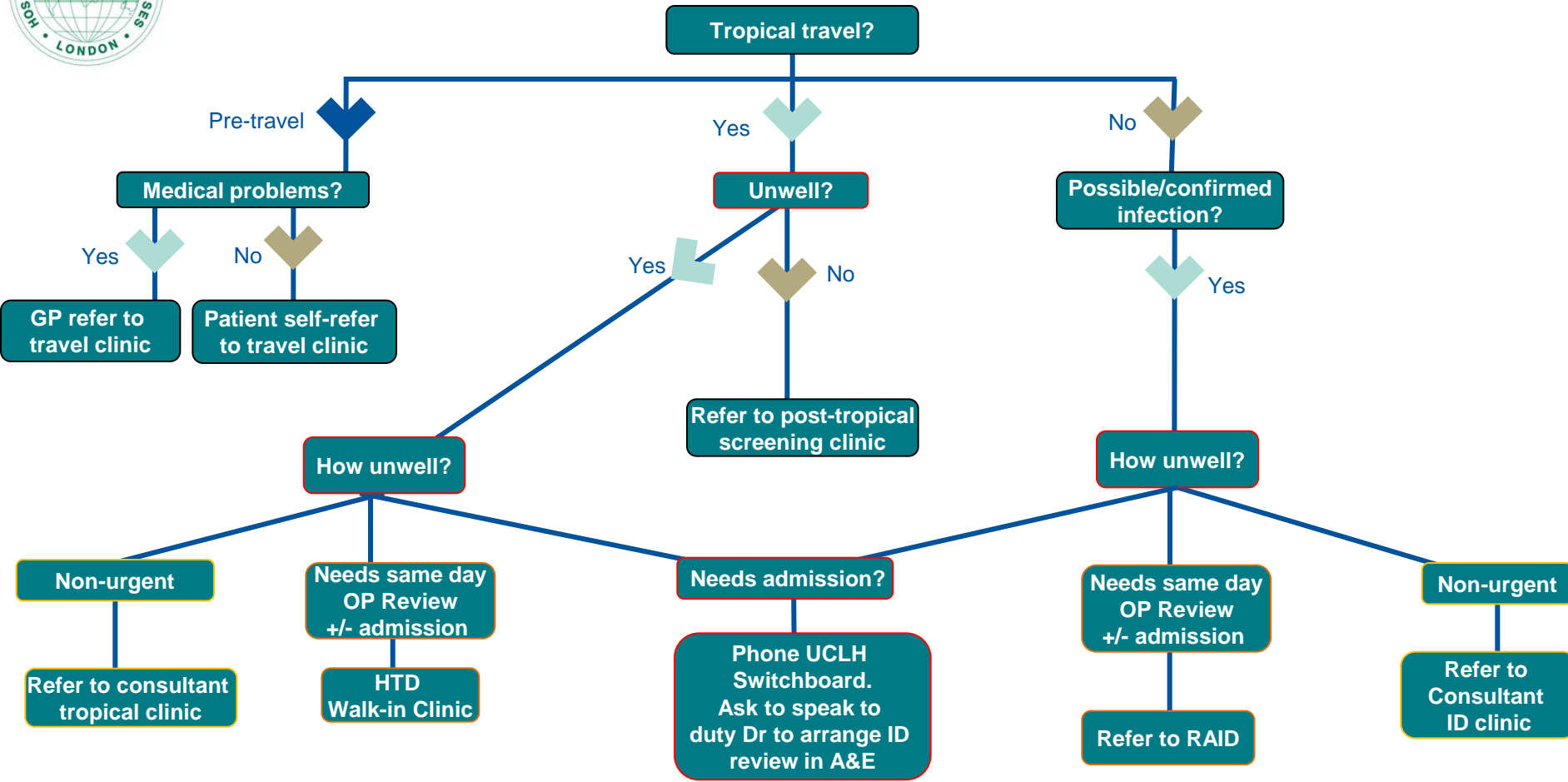


How to refer children and adolescent patients with suspected infection

How to refer adult patients with suspected infection

A&E	Call 020 3456 7890 ask for the HTD Tropical Registrar on call and send patient to A&E with a letter
HTD emergency walk-in clinic (M-F, 9am-4pm)	Patients can self-refer: 2nd Floor, Mortimer Market Centre, Capper St (map)
Rapid Access Infectious Diseases clinic (RAID)	Email referral letter to uclh.htdraid@nhs.net +/- call 020 3456 7890 ask for the HTD Tropical Registrar
New referrals to OPAT	Email referral letter to uclh.OPATatHTD@nhs.net +/- call 020 3456 7890 ask for the HTD Tropical Registrar
Non-urgent review	Please use e-Referrals For tertiary referrals please use uclh.htd@nhs.net
Travel clinic (pre-travel advice)	Complex commissioned patients (chronic medical problems, allergies, pregnant, over 65 years, children): email referral letter to uclh.htdtravelclinic@nhs.net Or otherwise healthy individuals can self-refer by phoning 020 3447 5999
Post tropical screening (asymptomatic patients)	Please use e-Referrals
24 hour phone advice	020 3456 7890 ask for the Tropical Registrar

*all cases of suspected malaria should be seen in hospital for a same day malaria film
